150th Anniversary of the Mennonite Brethren

On January 6, 1860,

eighteen individuals in a small village in what is now Ukraine signed a document declaring their intention to begin a renewal movement that became known as the Mennonite Brethren Church.

On July 12–18, 2010,

Mennonite Brethren from North America and around the globe will meet in British Columbia to celebrate how God continues to work through the Mennonite Brethren.

Renewing Identity & Mission: a Mennonite Brethren Consultation will open Celebration 2010 on the campus of ACTS Seminaries, a consortium of Trinity Western University in Langley, B.C., of which MB Biblical Seminary is a member. The evening plenary sessions, featuring Alfred Neufeld from Paraguay and a panel of international guests, will provide a global perspective on Mennonite Brethren identity and mission. During the two days, more than 30 presenters will address significant issues facing Mennonite Brethren in North America. Participants planning to attend the consultation can anticipate a rich time of reflection and conversation, along with the challenge to be God's missional people in the world. The consultation begins Monday evening (July 12) and runs till Wednesday noon.
